I continue to assist families with the new Medicare D program, if you would like some help, please call me.

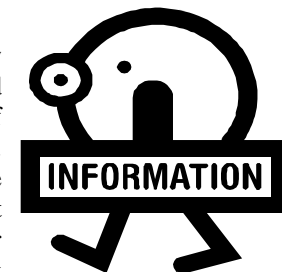

## HIPAA: What does it mean with Culture Change?

As the New Year starts I have been asked to review and clarify what HIPAA (Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act) is and what that means in terms of being able to share information with families and friends. One particular concern I have heard is that with culture change the neighborhoods are more like families than just residents in units and as they spend time with one another in that environment relationships and caring develop, but then when something happens with a resident (such as a hospitalization) and a family member comes to visit a loved one and asks about that hospitalized resident then they feel bad not being able to tell them anything. We would all like to believe that everyone asks and wants to know information due to genuine concern and nothing else, but this is not always the case and that is the reason for having the guidelines and laws that are in place. If family members want to share information themselves that is up to them, but the facility is not able to do that. There have always been ethical standards, such as confidentiality, that were enforced, but with HIPAA these are now law. People often think of HIPAA as being something that only effects them at the doctor's office, but it is any health care setting and all information that is effected. That is the reason that information cannot be shared about another's health/medical status even if it is asked about out of concern and caring. ## *Bill of Rights of Pleasant View Home*

These rights were signed by the residents of Pleasant View Home or the residents DPOA. If at anytime the resident or DPOA need to discuss them, we ask that you speak to the Social Service Designee here at Pleasant View Home. This year we have 33 Bill of Rights to review: These are read and discussed at the resident council meeting the first of each month.

19. The resident has a right to agree to perform voluntary or paid services for this facility if he or she desires, if there is no medical reason which would contradict the performing of the services, and if compensation for paid services is at or above prevailing rates.
20. The resident has the right to privacy in written communications, including the right to send and receive mail promptly that is unopened. The resident has a right of access to stationary, postage and writing implements at the resident's own expense.
21. The resident has the right to immediate access to any of the following: any representative of the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, any representative of the State, the resident's individual physician, the State's long term care ombudsman, the agency responsible for the protection of and advocacy system for mentally ill or developmentally disabled individuals.


