Chaplain's News Article August 27, 2018 Psalm 52:1 Why do you boast in evil, O mighty man? The goodness of God endures continually.

There are not many things that we might consider to be continual; but here are a few examples: light from the sun, heat from the sun, water flowing over the Niagara Falls, and the effects of gravity; but David, the psalmist, reminds the reader that God's goodness is continual. In doing so, he used a Hebrew word *hesed* variously translated as "covenantal love" or "loyal love." In reading this psalm, we are reminded of Doeg the Edomite, a wicked man, who butchered and killed scores of people, a tragic event that brought extreme grief to many people; but David was focused on God's "loyal love." Despite the terrible events that occurred, God was faithful (see verse 8); and David was staking his life and his eternal destiny on this truth. May we follow David's example.

We are always very grateful to those who speak in the Thursday evening (6:30 P.M.) Chapel Services. Residents look forward to these chapel services, and greatly appreciate the Bible teaching and gospel singing.
