John 6:54 Whoever eats My flesh and drinks My blood has eternal life; and I will raise him up at the last day.

Pastors and preachers learn very quickly that their message may encourage some in their audience, but also may disturb others. Moreover, some may leave the room feeling very confused. On this day Jesus was speaking to a crowd in Capernaum, His "home town" in the days of His public ministry. The words that He used are very graphic, and potentially also very disturbing; for He spoke of "eating His flesh," and "drinking His blood." What kind of talk is this? Well, for one thing, as with any speaker, don't take every word that he says LITERALLY! When Jesus spoke of "eating" and "drinking," the reader and listener should not take them literally, no more so than when Jesus told Nicodemus (John 3) that he needed to be "born again." Likewise when He told the Samaritan woman – "the water that I shall give…will become in him a fountain of water springing up into everlasting life" (John 4:14).

Reading the whole discourse (John 6:32-64), it becomes obvious that Jesus used graphic wording to stimulate their faith in Him, that if they would truly appropriate Him into their lives, they would gain the assurance of eternal life, and the confidence that their dead bodies one day would be resurrected (John 6:54). Many chose not to follow the Lord after this discourse (v. 66); but some like Peter stayed with Him, indicating that their faith truly was in Him; for Peter said, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life; and we have come to believe and know that You are the Christ, the Son of the living God" (v. 69).

Resident Rights

- Right to receive appropriate Social Services including: - Counseling
- Assistance solving problems with other residents

Assistance with contacting legal and financial professionals
Assistance with coordination of care with physicians, dental care practitioners, podiatry services, vision services, hearing services and any other referral services needed for life enhancement and achieving highest practicable level of functioning
Discharge planning

- Development or amendment of Advance Directives

- Right to have reasonable access to use of a telephone including TTY and TDD services and a place in facility where calls can be made without being overheard including the right to retain and use a cellular phone at resident's own expense
- Right to share a room with his/her spouse either of opposite gender or same-sex spouse/partner when married or united residents live in same facility and both spouses consent to arrangement
- Right to choose a roommate, when practicable
- Right to self-administer medications if interdisciplinary team when clinically appropriate
- Right to leave the facility by therapeutic leave/visits or discharge
- Right to refuse a transfer to another room in the facility if the purpose of the transfer aligns with those included in the Resident Right Acknowledgement Form
- Right to have protection against unfair transfer or discharge
