Mark 1:14, 15

Now after John was put in prison, Jesus came to Galilee, preaching the gospel of the kingdom of God, and saying, "The time is fulfilled; and the kingdom of God is at hand. Repent and believe in the gospel."

Ask several people, including children, "What's a preacher?" The answers you get back may include, 1) someone who yells a lot; 2) someone who speaks TOO LONG, 3) someone who tells (or, tries to tell) funny stories; or 4) the man who gets angry with the congregation, and scolds them. Jesus was a preacher. Was this Jesus' manner of preaching? I assert that it was not. When Jesus spoke, people listened with rapt attention. One place in the gospel accounts says that the people heard Him gladly. If anyone got scolded, it probably was a Pharisee or a scribe – because of their hypocrisy. Scholars in the Greek language tell us that the word translated "preach" means to "herald or to proclaim," which conveys a very different concept of preaching. In ancient times, a "herald" was sent out by a very important person, like a king, with an important message. Often, the message brought good news, like a victory over an enemy. On some occasions, the bearer of that message may have used a word translated in our Bibles as "gospel." Today's point is this: The Lord Jesus, our King, has sent out your pastor, the church's missionaries and evangelists, **and you and me** with a very important message – the gospel. If the hearers of this message respond to the message, for instance, the one contained in Romans 10:9-13, it will result in great joy and happiness in their hearts. Ask the Lord Jesus to help you to be His herald this week! For many weeks now, many in the Church have been thinking of our Lord's Passion. The week of April 6-9 is the high point of our thoughts, beginning with **Maunder Thursday Communion Services here at Pleasant View Home**, which will be served by pastors of the **Inman Ministerial Association**, first in Heritage Inn dining area at 10:30 A.M., then in the Main Dining Room at 10:50 A.M. Estate residents will be served at the Phase One Commons at 11:10 A.M.

Resident Rights

- Right to receive notices orally (spoken) and in writing (including Braille as needed) in a format and language he/she understands including:
- Right to be notified of changes including notification of resident representative:
 - * Accident involving resident which results in injury and has potential for requiring physician intervention
 - * Significant change in resident's physical, mental or psychosocial status
 - * Need to alter treatment significantly
 - * Development of a life-threatening condition
 - * Development of medical complications or adverse event(s)
 - * Decision to transfer or discharge resident from facility
- Right to manage his/her financial affairs including right to know, in advance, what charges facility may impose against a resident's personal funds
- Right to keep and use personal belongs and property if possessions do not interfere with rights, health or safety of other residents of facility
- Facility will not impose a charge against the personal funds of a resident for any item or service for which payment is made under Medicaid or Medicare; facility may charge resident for requested services that are more expensive than or in excess of covered services including but not limited to:
 - * Nursing Services
 - * Food and Nutrition
 - * Activity Program
 - * Room/Bed Maintenance
 - * Routine Personal hygiene items and services required to meet the needs of resident
 - * Medically- related social services
 - * Hospice Services elected by resident and pain for under Medicare Hospice Benefit or paid by Medicaid under State plan
- Choice of attending physician
- Privacy and confidentiality
- Voice grievances to facility or other agency or entity that hears grievances without discrimination or reprisal and without fear of discrimination or reprisal
